Today, the campus center encompasses five buildings spread out among 15 acres, including outdoor spaces and seating for 500 along an experiential pathway. There is a new exhibition hall, the expanded and renovated John Lewis Student Center and Stamp Commons, and a new space called the Pavilions, which includes an art studio and makerspace.

Just a few of the other updated and new spaces for students include Tech Rec, which offers bowling and billiards; a reflection space; a graduate student lounge; and a multicultural programs lounge. The student center has a small theater with wood floors and retractable seating, which is where campus admissions start tours, and a larger theater has tiered seating for nearly 300 guests. In total, there are nine unique event spaces.

The new exhibition hall includes a first-floor ballroom with a capacity of 1,000 lecture seats; the room can be divided into five spaces, and there are 13 different meeting rooms.

"From the day the doors opened on the John Lewis Student Center and Stamp Commons, the building has been buzzing with activity. The new lounge spaces, dining, student organization spaces, outdoor seating, they are all always full," said Lindsay Bryant, senior director of student and campus event centers. "The events spaces are booked, and you see when you go inside that people enjoy the spaces. The campus center project was a project that we knew would transform campus in a positive way for our students and it has. Students have found community in all the spaces and buildings."
